The Salvation Army provides specialist support for all adult victims of modern slavery in England and Wales through a government contract which was first awarded in 2011. We deliver a specialist support programme to protect and care for all adult victims of this heinous crime.

Our confidential Referral Helpline 0300 3038151 is available 24 hours a day, seven days a week to anyone who suspects that they, or someone they have come across, might be a victim of modern slavery in need of help.

Everyone we support receives access to a wide range of specialist services to meet their individual needs whether that is within a safehouse or through outreach support. This can include access to:

- confidential legal advice;
- health care;
- counselling; and
- educational opportunities
- financial support
- support in obtaining employment and housing

Successfully managing the delivery of support is never static and it requires The Salvation Army to monitor and anticipate trends and work with our subcontractors to ensure we are flexible and responsive to the continuing growth in referrals. It is also underpinned by a continuous search for ways to improve outcomes for the people in our care. In addition to the government contract, The Salvation Army also operates:

- a [Victim Care Fund](#), providing additional support to victims in the UK; and
- [Community Hubs](#), to provide continued support to victims moving towards an independent life
